DATE: January 13, 2023

There are six action items and an executive session on this agenda. First, a couple of notes on the consent agenda. We are still struggling with invoices that are paid online getting posted with the date they were paid rather than the date they are entered. The October credit card bill was paid on November 22, 2022, but wasn't entered until December 1. In order to provide the bill that shows on the check register, there is no credit card bill in this month's packet. There will be two next month. This is also the reason for the large outstanding balance on the bank reconciliation.

- A. The first action item is presentation of the bids to construct the new water well. The bids came in a bit higher than we expected. We received one bid for the entire project, three for only the drilling of the well and one for just the site work. The low bidder for the drilling portion (Contract A) was Weisinger Incorporated for \$1,314,500. The low bidder for the site prep (Contract B) is Duplichain Contractors for \$210,792. Neither of these numbers includes a generator. That would add another approximately \$220,000. All in, the price would be \$1,745,292. We have earmarked ARPA funds totaling \$1,268,179. That leaves a balance of \$477,113 that would need to come from reserve funds. If we forego the generator for now, it would lower our portion to \$257,113. We need the well, and having the bulk of it covered by Federal Funds is an opportunity we won't have again. There are other projects that this money can be used on, such as completing the line around the loop, but the "bang for the buck" will be lower on those projects.
- B. This is the renewal of a contract we have with Rusk Rural to supply them water on an as needed basis. The contract was provided by Rusk Rural and does not include a rate increase. Our ordinance calls for water supply companies to pay the same as residential and commercial customers, being:

- C. This is an interlocal agreement with Texas State University for the controlled buy of tobacco products by minors. Chief Heagney will use minors to attempt to purchase tobacco products in local stores to determine their compliance with underage sales laws. We will be paid \$125 for up to 10 successfully completed buys.
- D. Our lease with the Rusk State Hospital for the use of the Gun Range expired a few months ago. Former Interim Chief Pippins started the renegotiation process with Chief Heagney completing it. The only real change was to some language in Section 7 that gives a little flexibility on who can use the range and for what purpose. Everything else is the same as the expired agreement. The term is 5 years for \$10.
- E. Several years ago, we had the land in the Industrial Park listed with a local Realtor. The listing has been expired for quite some time. We are having some inquiries about lots out there, and with the addition of the Economic Development Director, I think it would be a good idea to get the land listed again. It would speed up the process of consummating a sale should an interested party want to purchase. I have reached out for quotes on commission rates, suggested list price, etc. I will have that information for you on Thursday.
- F. Joe's Sports Bar has submitted a request to close Henderson Street from 4th to 5th Street on February 18, 2022 from 4pm to 11pm. In addition, they would like to serve alcohol in this closed off area for a street dance.

Analysis of Financial Data

The General Fund has generated \$629,360.45 in revenue and \$457,256.39 in expenses. We have collected nearly half of our property tax, which is typical. Sales Tax continues to be strong.

The Mayor and Council department is slightly over budget due to increased legal expenses and nearly 26% of the budgeted 380 agreement being paid already. That is offset by the increased Sales Tax. I need to work with the accountant to figure out what is going on with the City Manager Budget. There is something getting coded to salary that shouldn't be. The figures posted don't match the payroll register, but it isn't readily obvious what it is. The fire department has had some costly repairs and the truck loan payment is due in October, skewing the ratio for a few months.

The Enterprise Fund has \$742,367.91 in revenue and \$446,095.02 in expenses. 16.6% of the year has elapsed.

The apparent low bidder at the time of opening was Weisinger, Inc. out of Willis, Texas. Following review and tabulation of the bids received Weisinger, Inc. remains the lowest responsible bidder for the City's project.

Out of the nine (9) general contractors that were holding plans and specifications, two (2) bids were received. The bids ranged from a low of \$210,792.00 for the base bid to a high of \$254,777.00. Conduct 10 controlled buy/stings and follow-ups of tobacco permitted retail outlets and sales and use tax permitted e-cigarette retail outlets using minors as decoys, to determine compliance with applicable laws in accordance with Texas Health and Safety Code §161.082 – Sale of cigarettes, e-cigarettes, or tobacco products to persons younger than 21 years of age prohibited: Proof of age required. Work shall be performed following the details outlined in attached Exhibit A – Scope of Work, and Exhibit B – Performance Measures.

III. Basis for Calculating Reimbursable Costs

Performing Party shall be paid \$125.00 for each correct and completed controlled buy/sting and follow-up reported on the Cigarette, E-cigarette, and Tobacco Controlled Buy/Sting Report form (TEP-102 (Rev 9/2020)) (for a maximum of 10 Controlled Buy/Stings and Follow-ups x \$125.00 each for a total of \$1,250.00). Payment will be based on the receipt and approval of an invoice for services following the details outlined in attached Exhibit C – Payment for Services.

IV. Contract Amount

The total amount of this Contract shall not exceed ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY DOLLARS AND NO/100 CENTS (\$1,250.00). This is the maximum amount collectable under the Contract as written.

V. Payment of Services

Receiving Party will remit payments to Performing Party for services satisfactorily performed under this Contract in accordance with the *Texas Prompt Payment Act, Chapter 2251, Texas Government Code*.

VII. Term of the Contract

EXHIBIT A SCOPE OF WORK

The Performing Party shall diligently render the following performance:

Contract funds shall be used to support the enforcement activities and additional program requirements outlined below. The Performing Party shall meet the assigned Performance Measures assigned in Exhibit B.

1. Enforcement Activities

The Performing Party shall:

- a. Conduct Controlled Buy/Stings and Follow-ups of tobacco permitted retail outlets and sales and use tax permitted e-cigarette retail outlets using youth as decoys, to determine compliance with applicable laws in accordance with Texas Health and Safety Code §161.082 Sale of cigarettes, e-cigarettes, or tobacco products to persons younger than 21 years of age prohibited: Proof of age required. Refer to Exhibit B Schedule Performance Measures, for the number of controlled buy/stings to be conducted.
- b. Conduct controlled buy/stings and follow-ups in target areas to include high retail density, low socio economic, high risk areas, and local perspective of previous sales to youth and/or complaints received.
- c. Record the results of the controlled buy/stings conducted using the Cigarette, Ecigarette, and Tobacco Controlled Buy/Sting Report form (TEP-102 (Rev 9/2020)) provided by the Texas School Safety Center at Texas State University.
- d. Use non-smoking male and female youth ages 16 –20 (born on or after September 1, 2001) in accordance with *Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 161.088 Enforcement; Announced Inspections.*
- e. Use the State Comptroller of Public Accounts most recent Tobacco Permitted Retail Outlet List and Sale and Use Tax Outlet List of e-cigarette retail outlets for the controlled buy/stings to obtain retail outlet name, address, and tobacco permit numbers.
- f. Conduct follow-up controlled buy/stings of retail outlets found to be in violation of the sale of cigarettes, e-cigarettes, or tobacco products to youth. Reasons for follow-up may include: 1) repeated violations, 2) knowledge of historical perspective of previous sales to youth, and /or 3) complaints received where a follow-up is needed. Follow-up controlled buy/stings shall be conducted within two to ten (2-10) days of original controlled buy/sting.

2. Training Activities

The Performing Party shall:

- a. Participate in a web-based training session conducted by Texas School Safety Center at Texas State University prior to implementation of contract activities. Representative(s) shall include the person(s) assigned to the implementation of the contract activities, and/or the supervisor overseeing the day-to-day activities of this contract, and the person(s) conducting the enforcement activities outlined in Exhibit A – Scope of Work.
- b. Participate in any and all ongoing technical assistance and training activities offered by the Texas School Safety Center at Texas State University.

3. Reporting Requirements

The Performing Party shall:

- a. Submit a completed Monthly Summary and Invoice form (TEP-101 (Rev 9/2022)) provided by the Texas School Safety Center at Texas State University that tallies the number of controlled buy/stings and follow-ups conducted and number of citations issued within the performance reporting period.
- b. Submit billing information for services provided in the invoice section of the Monthly Summary and Invoice form (TEP-101 (Rev 9/2022)). Payment amount for services is outlined in **Exhibit C Payment for Services.** The Monthly Summary and Invoice form (TEP-101 (Rev 9/2022)) shall be signed by the designated authorized official
- c. Attach completed Cigarette, E-cigarette, and Tobacco Controlled Buy/Sting Report forms (TEP-102 (Rev 9/2020)) for each controlled buy/sting conducted for the performance reporting period. The total activity reported shall correspond to the preestablished monthly goal listed in the Work Plan (TEP-100 (Rev 9/2020)).
- d. The Monthly Summary and Invoice form (TEP-101 (Rev 9/2022)) shall be submitted to the Texas School Safety Center on the first day of the month. The report may be mailed to the Texas School Safety Center, Attn. Bea Pyle, 601 University Dr., San Marcos, Texas 78666 or emailed to beapyle@txstate.edu.
- e. Texas School Safety Center forwards violation information to the Comptroller of Public Accounts as required by law, (*Texas Health & Safety Code, Section 161.090 Reports of Violation*) by the 10th working day of the month for activity of the previous month.

4. Additional Program Requirements

The Performing Party shall:

a. Assign a minimum of one (1) agency representative to the implementation of the activities of this contract, and provide the name(s) of any key personnel changes that impact the requirements of this contract to via email: beapyle@txstate.edu or phone: 512-245-0821.

- b. Coordinate enforcement activities with other law enforcement agencies within the Performing Party's area. This Public Benefit Lease Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into between the **Health** and **Human Services Commission** ("Lessor" or "HHSC"), for and on behalf of its facility the Rusk State Hospital ("Facility"), and **City of Rusk**, **Texas** ("Lessee").

2. LEGAL AUTHORITY

Lessor, as successor in function to the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, the Department of State Health Services, and the Department of Aging and Disability Services, is authorized to lease real property under its control pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Health and Safety Code § 533.087 or Texas Health and Safety Code § 533A.087.

3. PROPERTY LEASED

Lessor agrees to lease approximately 3 acres as described in Exhibit A (the "Premises") on the grounds of Facility to Lessee, who has agreed to lease Premises from Lessor.

4. CONSIDERATION

- (a) Consideration for this Agreement is \$10.00 for the term.
- (b) Lessee will pay Consideration in the form of check or money order payable to "Rusk State Hospital, Attention: Michelle Foster, 805 N. Dickinson Drive, Rusk, Texas 75785 unless otherwise notified in writing by Lessor.

5. TERM OF LEASE AGREEMENT

- (a) The term of this Agreement is <u>five years</u>, commencing on <u>September 1, 2022</u>, and ending on <u>August 31, 2027</u>, inclusive of such beginning and ending dates, unless terminated sooner.
- (b) Lessor and Lessee agree that this Agreement is renewable only by mutual consent of the Parties in writing. Lessee will give Lessor written notice of its desire to renew this Agreement at least 90 calendar days prior to expiration. Each renewal will be evidenced by a new lease agreement or written addendum to this Agreement, signed by the Parties.
- (c) Any holding over by Lessee after the ending date of this Agreement creates a new holdover tenancy subject to the same terms and conditions as the original tenancy, except that the holdover tenancy will be from month to month and terminable upon one-month notice.

6. TERMINATION

- (a) It is mutually agreed between Lessee and Lessor that if Premises are, during the term of this Agreement or prior to it, damaged by fire or any other cause or causes, Lessee, in its sole discretion, may either finance the repair of such damage or terminate the Agreement. During the time of any such repair, if the space cannot be fully utilized by Lessee, the payments and/or reimbursements will be equitably adjusted during the period Premises remain unusable by Lessee.
- (b) Lessor and Lessee expressly agree that either Party may, at any time within the primary or any renewal period, terminate this Agreement without incurring any further liability after

termination by providing, as appropriate, written notice not less than 90 calendar days before the specified termination date.

(c) Any termination of this Agreement will not affect the rights and obligations of the Parties accrued prior to the effective date of the termination and such obligations will survive and remain enforceable following the termination.

7. ALLOWED USE AND USERS

- (a) Lessee will be allowed to use Premises for the purpose of law enforcement training, weaponry testing, and shooting practice (Lessee's "Program"). Program activities shall only be permitted for specific users as follows (the "Permitted Users").
 - (b) Permitted Users are the following:
 - i. Employees of Lessee
 - ii. County, State or Federal law enforcement employees
 - iii. Third Parties under a current written contract with or for Lessee's police department
 - iv. Manufacturer representatives of law enforcement related weaponry
- (c) Discharge of firearms, shooting or training by the general public or any person not designated as a Permitted User is strictly prohibited.
- (d) Lessee will not cause any nuisance or disruption that interferes with or impairs the safe, efficient, and smooth operation of Facility.

8. RESPONSIBLE PARTY

- (a) Lessee will be responsible for operating Program and for employing, whether in a compensated or voluntary capacity, all on-site Program staff who will not be construed in any way to be in the employment of Lessor or Facility.
- (b) Lessee will be responsible for obtaining all governmental licenses and permits, if any, required for the operation of Lessee's Program on Premises. Lessor will not be required to effectuate any zoning changes to allow for Lessee's intended use of Premises.

9. BUILDING MAINTENANCE, REPAIRS, WASTE REMOVAL

- (a) Lessee, at its expense, will make repairs to Lessee-installed appliances, systems, structures and components.
- (b) Lessee will reimburse Facility for repair expenses related to Premises damage caused by misuse or negligence, whether intentional or not, by Lessee's staff, visitors or guests. Facility will invoice Lessee for repairs as they occur. Payment is due within 30 days of invoicing.
- (c) Lessee will reimburse Facility for repairs for which Lessee's insurance company is liable. Terms of Insurance and Indemnification and Hold Harmless sections of this Agreement will control with respect to repairs or maintenance required due to any condition for which Lessee maintains insurance.
- (d) Lessee will be responsible for furnishing appropriate outside trash and refuse receptacles and for the removal of trash and refuse from Premises, including but not limited to, all brass and shell casings.

10. ALTERATIONS TO PREMISES AND CAPITAL/STRUCTURAL IMPROVEMENTS

(a) Lessee may not locate on Premises any fixtures without the express written consent of Lessor, such consent not to be unreasonably withheld.

- (b) Upon Agreement expiration, the fixtures and related components will become the property of Lessor.
- (c) Lessee, at its sole cost, will have the right to have an exterior sign installed. The sign will have dimensions not to exceed 8 feet wide by 8 feet tall. The sign and its location must be approved in writing by Lessor prior to installation.
- (d) Lessee will have no right to encumber in any fashion Lessor's fee simple estate in Premises. Any fixed improvements made to Premises must be free of any debt or encumbrances prior to installation.
- (e) Lessee may request authorization from Lessor to make alterations or capital/structural improvements to Premises. Upon receiving expressed written authorization of Lessor, Lessee may commence such projects at Lessee's sole expense. No alteration or capital/structural improvement projects will be undertaken by Lessee without the express written authorization of Lessor.

11. MANAGEMENT OF PREMISES AND ADJACENT FACILITY LAND AREA AS A RESULT OF PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

Lessee shall utilize its best efforts to prevent high levels of hazardous waste accumulation or disposal on the Premises or adjacent Facility land as a result of its Program or other activities or actions of its invitees or guests. With respect to spent lead fragments created by the Program, Lessee shall generally follow the guidelines of the Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") document EPA-902-B-01-001 "Best Management Practices for Lead at Outdoor Shooting Ranges" (or any revision thereof) to prevent contamination or accelerated depreciation of the Premises value due to high levels affecting ground water, runoff or soils. As a requirement of this Agreement, Lessee shall conduct the following during the term of the Agreement:

- (a) Operate and alter the Premises in a manner for maximum containment and control of bullets, shot and bullet fragments as a result of the Program.
- (b) Take measures to maximize prevention of lead migration or outfall beyond the Premises land area.
- (c) Twice annually monitor for and remove excess lead buildup, if determined as needed by Lessor.
- (d) Twice annually monitor for and adjust soil pH, if determined as needed by Lessor.
- (e) Control runoff of any area of the Premises where lead may accumulate.
- (f) Document all of the above activities, including but not limited to volume, spread rate, location and method of lime applications.
- (g) Forward at a minimum of once annually the records of f, above.
- (h) Contact Lessor immediately upon any notice or observation of a contamination beyond acceptable levels as declared by the EPA.
- (i) Annually sample and have lab tested soil samples from random areas possibly containing lead or other contamination due to Program activities. The first sampling and related report shall be completed and forwarded to Lessor during the month of April 2023 and repeated during the month of April each year thereafter. Lab test results shall be reported directly from the lab utilized.

12. EMERGENCIES

An emergency is defined as an unusual or critical occurrence requiring immediate repair, action or remediation to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the occupants and employees of

the Facility. In the case of an emergency, Lessee will take appropriate actions to secure the health, safety and welfare of people and property. Lessee will immediately inform the appropriate staff at Facility, by telephone and will provide a description of the emergency, insurance coverage (as appropriate) and any other pertinent information to Facility.

13. INSPECTIONS

- (a) Lessor reserves the right to conduct periodic inspections of Premises to determine Lessee's compliance with the Agreement provisions. Lessee agrees to permit Lessor or its representatives, to enter Premises for the purpose of inspection and/or for performing work consistent with Lessor's inspection and maintenance programs. Except in the case of an emergency, Lessor will perform their inspections and work in a manner not to interfere with Lessee's Program.
- (b) From time to time, Lessor may inspect or arrange for the inspection of Premises, to determine the need for repair or maintenance due to unusual events, such as storm, fire, and/or water damage.

14. PARKING

Lessee will only park in areas designated by Lessor. Inoperable vehicles may not be stored on the Premises for longer than 10 calendar days. Vehicles parked in non-designated areas or inoperable will be towed at Lessee's and owner's own expense.

15. SECURITY

Lessee will not in any capacity rely upon the security personnel employed at Facility. Lessee will provide sufficient security measures for its Program.

16. ACCEPTANCE OF LEASED PREMISES

AS SIGNIFIED BY THE INITIALS OF LESSEE'S REPRESENTATIVE HEREIN BELOW, LESSEE HAS INSPECTED THE PHYSICAL AND TOPOGRAPHIC CONDITION OF PREMISES AND ACCEPTS SAME "AS IS" IN ITS EXISTING CONDITION. LESSOR DISCLAIMS ANY AND ALL WARRANTIES OF HABITABILITY, MERCHANTABILITY, SUITABILITY, FITNESS FOR ANY PURPOSE, AND ANY OTHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTY.

17. DEFAULT

- (a) Failure to comply with any provision of this Agreement will constitute an event of default. Lessor will have the right to terminate this Agreement if Lessee defaults. In the case of default or termination, Lessee will not be relieved of sums due at the time of termination or in the future. In the case of default, Lessee will not be entitled to remove any improvements from Premises until all obligations under this Agreement have been satisfied by Lessee, as evidenced in writing by Lessor. No provision of this Agreement will preclude Lessor from seeking any other remedy it may have at law or equity.
- (b) Neither Lessor nor Lessee will be in default in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement if such performance is prevented or delayed by Force Majeure; provided, the Party claiming Force Majeure notifies the other Party of such occurrence within 10 business days and promptly commences, diligently pursues and takes all reasonable actions to limit the effect of the Force Majeure. Force Majeure is understood to be any cause which is beyond the reasonable

control of the Party affected, including but not limited to war, hostilities, revolution, civil commotion, strike, lockout, epidemic, accident, fire, wind, and flood; or because of any law, or order, proclamation, regulation, or ordinance of the state or federal government or of any subdivision of such government.

- (c) Neither the acceptance by one Party of any payments hereunder nor the failure by one Party to complain of any action, non-action or default concerning the other Party will constitute a waiver of any Party's rights hereunder. Failure of notice by a Party for any act or event will not constitute a waiver of any right or obligation set forth in the Agreement.
- (d) The failure of Lessor or Lessee to insist on one or more instances of strict performance of any of the covenants of this Agreement will not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of such covenants in future instances, but such covenants will continue and remain in full force and effect.
- (e) In the event Lessee is in default in the payment of Consideration and/or reimbursements or other charges due under this Agreement, or otherwise breaches its covenants or obligations, and remains in default for a period of 30 calendar days after Lessee receives written notice from Lessor of such default, or if Lessee vacates or abandons Premises at any time during the term of this Agreement for a period of 90 continuous days, Lessor will have the right to terminate this Agreement and declare it at an end, and enter upon and/or take possession of Premises. Lessor also will have the remedies now and hereafter provided by this Agreement and any common law, constitutional law, or statutory law remedies for recovery of any rental payments or reimbursement payments due under this Agreement, possession of Premises, and damages occasioned by such default.
- (f) If Lessor defaults in the performance of any of the covenants or conditions which Lessor is required to perform under this Agreement and such default continues for 30 calendar days after Lessor receives written notice from Lessee, then Lessee may, at its option, terminate this Agreement and Lessee will have no further obligations under this Agreement other than the repair and restoration of Premises in accordance with this Agreement.
- (g) Lessor has and is expressly granted a valid first lien on all the goods, chattels, and fixtures which Lessee may own on Premises, except for ambulances, to secure the payment of Consideration. Such first lien extends to the proceeds of any insurance accruing to Lessee by reason of the destruction of or damage to any and all such property. It is further agreed the first lien is not a waiver of any other statutory lien given or which may be given Lessor but is in addition to the statutory lien.

18. RULES

Lessee agrees to abide by any and all rules promulgated by Lessor and Facility related to activities and visitation of areas of Facility outside of the Premises area.

19. RIGHT TO SELL PREMISES

Lessor expressly retains and reserves the right to sell Premises, in whole or in part, during the term of this Agreement. Lessor will provide Lessee written notice of any decision to sell all or part of Premises at least 30 calendar days prior to the effective date of any such sale.

20. DELIVERY OF PREMISES UPON TERMINATION

(a) Providing Lessee is not in default, upon termination of this Agreement by lapse of time or otherwise, Lessee will, within a reasonable time thereafter, at its sole option and expense, remove from Premises its trade fixtures, appliances or other personal property placed or owned by Lessee

and not designated to become the property of Lessor. Lessee will repair any damages of Premises caused by the removal.

- (b) Lessor will perform a final inspection of Premises after Lessee has vacated Premises. Lessee will be responsible for paying all costs associated with repairs and maintenance consistent with this Agreement that are necessary as determined by the final inspection, reasonable use, wear and tear and damages by the elements excepted. Payment is due within 30 days of notification.
 - (c) Lessee will surrender all keys for Premises to Lessor.

21. INSURANCE

Lessee will secure policies of Insurance as set forth below:

Lessee will maintain liability coverage during the term of this Agreement adequate to cover Lessee's interests through insurance policies obtained from insurance underwriter(s) licensed in the State of Texas.

Lessee will maintain business renters' insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000.00 and, upon request, will provide Lessor with a copy of the insurance policy and endorsements. The policy will name Lessor and Facility as additional insureds. It is expressly understood and agreed that the proceeds from such coverage will be applied as first priority to repair or replace the building and any improvements unless all Parties agree in writing to alternate use of the proceeds.

The policy will specify fire insurance and extended coverage on any Facility building in an amount not less than \$100,000.00 on the replacement value of the building and any improvements.

22. INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS

- (a) TO THE EXTENT ALLOWED BY THE CONSTITUTION AND THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, LESSEE WILL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS LESSOR FROM ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, DAMAGES, COSTS, EXPENSES, OR LIABILITY ARISING OUT OF LESSEE'S USE OF PREMISES, EXCEPT FOR THOSE EVENTS ARISING OUT OF THE GROSS NEGLIGENCE OR INTENTIONAL ACTS OF LESSOR OR THEIR EMPLOYEES, OFFICERS AND AGENTS. LESSEE WILL, UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES, BRING OR CAUSE A SUIT TO BE FILED AGAINST LESSOR FOR ANY EVENT ARISING OUT OF THE USE OF PREMISES.
- (b) Neither Facility nor Lessor is liable for the negligent acts or omissions of the Lessee, its officers, employees, or agents, which cause the death, bodily injury or illness of any person or damage to or destruction of any property.
 - (c) This Agreement does not create a joint venture, partnership, agency or other legal relationship between Lessor and Lessee other than the one of Lessor and Lessee.

23. ASSIGNMENT

Lessee will not assign this Agreement to any other party without the express written consent of Lessor. Lessor will exercise its sole discretion regarding approval of any assignment. Premises may not be divided for the purposes of assigning a portion of Premises to another party. Lessee agrees that it will not assign or sublet all or any part of the leased Premises to any private parties (persons or corporations). Lessor reserves the right to assign all rights and responsibilities under this Agreement to another agency of the State of Texas without written consent of Lessee.

24. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between Lessee and Lessor regarding the subject matter of this Agreement. No oral or written representation or promise made by any person prior to or contemporaneous with the execution of this instrument is binding on any Party. This Agreement will not be amended, changed, or extended except by written document signed by duly qualified representatives of each Party.

25. GRAMMATICAL INTERPRETATION

Whenever the singular number is used, it includes the plural, and the masculine gender includes the feminine and neuter gender.

26. ARTICLE HEADINGS

Headings used are for the convenience of the Parties for reference and identification and will not be construed to limit or alter the meaning of the provisions of this Agreement.

27. PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES

It is expressly agreed and understood between Lessor and Lessee that Lessor is an agency of the State of Texas and nothing in this Agreement will be construed as a waiver or relinquishment by Lessor of its right to claim such exemptions, privileges, and immunities as may be provided by law.

28. SEVERABILITY

Should any term or provision of this Agreement be found invalid by a court of law, the remainder of this Agreement will not be affected and all other provisions in this Agreement remain valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

29. GOVERNING LAW

- (a) This Agreement is being executed and delivered and is intended to be performed in the State of Texas. The laws of Texas will govern the validity, construction, interpretation, and enforcement of this Agreement.
- (b) This Agreement is construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. The venue for all legal proceedings pertaining to this Agreement is in Travis County, Texas.

30. AGREEMENT REPRESENTATIVES

The following will act as the Representative authorized to administer activities and receive all non-legal notices under this Agreement on behalf of their respective Party:

Any legal notice from Lessee to Lessor shall be deemed delivered when actually received by Lessor.

- (b) This Agreement inures to the benefit of and is binding upon the personal representatives, successors in interest and assigns of Lessee and Lessor, but these provisions do not constitute permission for Lessee to assign all or any part of this Agreement. Each Party represents that the

person executing this Agreement on behalf of that Party has full authority to do so and to bind that Party to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

33. LESSEE'S AUTHORITY

The person or persons executing this Agreement on behalf of Lessee, or representing themselves as executing the Agreement on behalf of Lessee, guarantee that they have been fully authorized by Lessee to execute the Agreement on Lessee's behalf and to validly and legally bind Lessee to all the terms and provisions contained herein.

34. LESSOR'S AUTHORITY

Lessor represents it has good and sufficient title to Premises, and full power and authority to execute this Agreement and to place Lessee in possession of Premises in full satisfaction of and in compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. This Agreement is subject to any and all outstanding rights-of-way, easements, restrictions, covenants and mineral interests affecting Premises.
