RUSK POLICE DEPT, has adopted a detailed written policy on racial profiling. Our policy:

- 1) clearly defines acts constituting racial profiling;
- 2) strictly prohibits peace officers employed by the RUSK POLICE DEPT. from engaging in racial profiling;
- 3) implements a process by which an individual may file a complaint with the <u>RUSK POLICE DEPT</u>. if the individual believes that a peace officer employed by the <u>RUSK POLICE DEPT</u>. has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual;
- 4) provides public education relating to the agency's complaint process;
- 5) requires appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the <u>RUSK POLICE DEPT</u>, who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the <u>RUSK POLICE DEPT</u>, policy;
- 6) requires collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a warning or citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:
 - a, the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;
 - b, whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search;
 - c. whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before detaining that individual:
 - d. whether the peace officer used physical force that resulted in bodily injury during the stop;
 - e. the location of the stop;
 - f. the reason for the stop.
- 7) requires the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) to:
 - a, the Commission on Law Enforcement; and
 - b. the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.

The <u>RUSK POLICE DEPT</u>, has satisfied the statutory data audit requirements as prescribed in Article 2.133(c), Code of Criminal Procedure during the reporting period.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RUSK, TEXAS ORDERING A REGULAR CITY GENERAL ELECTION FOR COUNCIL MEMBERS MAYOR, DISTRICTS 1 AND DISTRICT 2, TO BE HELD ON May 06, 2023 OF THE CITY OF RUSK, TEXAS, AS PERMITTED UNDER SECTION 2.051 OF THE TEXAS ELECTION CODE

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RUSK, TEXAS:

Section 1: It is hereby ordered that a Regular General Election be held in the City of Rusk on Saturday, May 6th, 2023 at which election the following officers and proposition be voted on by the qualified voters of the City:

POSITION

Mayor Councilmember District 1 Councilmember District 2

Section 2: The present boundaries of the City constituting one election precinct, the polls shall be open for voting from seven o' clock (7:00) a.m. until seven o'clock (7:00) p.m. at the following polling place:

Rusk Independent School District Administrative Offices 203 East 7th Street Rusk, Texas 75785

Section 3: The election judge will be:

Anna Torres

The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to provide a copy of the RESOLUTION to the judge as written notice of appointment as required by Section 32.009 of the Texas Election Code.

The Presiding Judge shall have the authority to appoint no more than (3) clerks to assist in the holding of such election, but in no event shall the Presiding Judge appoint less than two clerks. Said election officers shall also serve as the Early Voting Ballot Board for such election; the Presiding judge of such election precinct shall also serve as the Presiding Officer of the Early Voting Ballot Board.

The Election Judge shall be compensated at an hourly rate of \$13.00; the alternate judge and clerks assisting shall be compensated at an hourly rate of \$11.00. The Election Judge shall be compensated in the amount of \$25.00 for the delivery of election equipment and supplies as

provided by Title 3, Section 32.091 (a) of the State Election Code, if such delivery is necessary. These appointments are for a single election held on May 6th, 2023.

Section 4: The City Secretary is hereby appointed clerk for early voting; the appointment of a deputy clerk or clerks for early voting by the City Secretary shall be in accordance with Section 83.001 et seq. of the Texas Election Code. The place for early voting for such election is hereby designated as:

City Hall City of Rusk, Texas 205 South Main Rusk, Texas 75785

Said clerks shall keep said office open during the hours that the City Hall is regularly open for business, that is, from eight o' clock (8:00) a.m. until 4:30 p.m., on each day for early voting which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or an official State holiday.

Said clerks shall not permit anyone to vote early by personal appearance on any day which is not a regular working day for the clerk's office, and under no circumstances shall they permit anyone to vote early by personal appearance at any time when such office is not open the public. The above-described place for early voting is also the clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail may be sent. The early voting clerk, in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code, shall maintain a roster listing each person who votes early by personal appearance and each person to whom a ballot to be voted by mail is sent. The roster shall be maintained in a form approved by the Secretary of State.

Section 5: All ballots shall be prepared in accordance with Texas Election Code. Paper ballots shall be used for early voting by mail and paper ballots and Hart Intercivic Duo Touch Writer Voting System shall be used for early voting by personal appearance and voting on Election Day, both of which are part of the Hart Intercivic Duo Touch Writer 2.5.3Voting System. The City Council hereby adopts for use in early and election day voting the Hart Intercivic Duo Voting System as approved by the Secretary of State. All expenditures necessary for the conduct of election, the purchase of materials therefore and the employment of all election officials is hereby authorized.

Section 6: The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to furnish all necessary election supplies to conduct such election.

Section 7: Notice of election shall be given in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code and returns of such notice shall be made as provided for in said Code. The Mayor shall issue all necessary orders and writs for such election, and returns of such election shall be made to the City Secretary after the closing of the polls.

Section 8: Said election shall be held in accordance with the Texas Election Code and the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended.

JOINT ELECTION AGREEMENT

Between

City of Rusk and the Rusk Independent School District

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 9 day of February, 2023, by and between the Rusk Independent School District (hereinafter referred to as the "District") and the City of Rusk, Texas, (hereinafter referred to as "City"), is for the conduct of Election Day voting by personal appearance to be held at a common location for the purpose of conducting the District's Trustee Election and the City's General Election.

THIS AGREEMENT is effective upon the approval of the governing bodies of each party.

IN CONSIDERATION of the premises and mutual promises and obligations herein set forth, it is agreed:

- (1) Both entities will conduct separate early voting;
- (2) Both entities will be responsible for the purchase and/or acquisition of their own voting supplies, the costs of printing their respective ballots and any cost associated with providing electronic or automated voting machines for their respective elections;
- (3) Both entities will be responsible for providing their own locked ballot boxes;
- (4) Both entities will utilize a joint polling location, specifically the Rusk Independent School District Administration Building, 203 East 7th Street, Rusk, Texas 75785, on Saturday, May 6, 2023;
- (5) Any rental or charge for use of polling location on Saturday, May 6, 2023 will be shared equally by the District and the City;
- (6) Both entities will pay their respective election officials (Polling Judges and Alternates, Early voting Clerks, etc.) separately for time and services provided as allowed by law;
- (7) Both entities will be responsible for posting the election results for their respective elections;
- (8) Each entity will be responsible for the cost of any published legal notices required by law;
- (9) Any further expenditures to be incurred pertaining to the election not specifically addressed above will be paid by the respective entity incurring the expenditure;
- (10) Each entity will be responsible for their own election records and canvassing of the election;


- (11) In the event that either of the entities determines to cancel its election, for any reason, the other entity shall have the right to conduct its election and utilize the polling location described above as if the other entity had not cancelled its election; and
- (12) In the event that the District cancels its election and the City determines to hold its election, the City shall have the right to conduct its election and utilize the polling location described above at no charge.

The purpose and intent of this Joint Election Agreement is in compliance with Section 11.0581, Texas Education Code, requiring school districts holding trustee elections to have joint polling places with municipalities located within the boundaries of such districts.





ORDINANCE	NO.	2023-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF CITY OF RUSK, TEXAS PROVIDING FOR A COLLECTION FEE FOR DELINQUENT UTILITY BILLS.

WHEREAS pursuant to the authority granted to it by State Law, the City Council of City of Rusk, acting in the best interest of the city, find that is necessary to recoup collection fees for past due utility bills in operating a utility system in accordance with TEX. LOC. GOV'T CODE 552.001 (b).

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Rusk, Texas, find that is necessary to recoup collection fees for past due utility bills to protect the interest of the municipality.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RUSK, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the City's Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to provide as follows:

Sec. <u>1101</u>

Collection services fee, A collection services fee of 30% shall be added to each account for collection by a collection agency if such account is delinquent for at least thirty (30) days.

ACCOUNTS RECEIVEABLE COLLECTIONS OVERVIEW

OVERVIEW

As a MVBA LLC client, we will work closely with you to receive delinquent accounts and continue the collection efforts until resolved or statute is reached. MVBA LLC will work accounts that are 31 days delinquent up to 4 years delinquent. - 2. <u>Letters:</u> Accounts are eligible for a letter every 45 days. The letters do not use threatening language and provide the debtor with all the information they will need to pay the debt.
- 3. <u>Phone calls: MVBA LLC Contact Center is open from 9 AM- 6 PM and handles inbound calls and outbound calls.</u> Each caller goes through a verification process to ensure we are talking to the debtor and all calls are recorded.
- 4. <u>Disputes:</u> If a debtor wants to dispute the debt, we ask for it to be sent in writing. Once received, we forward to the client for response or validation.
- 5. <u>Payments:</u> MVBA LLC will assist debtors with payment in full or payment arrangements. Debtors can pay with a credit card, money order or cashier's check

INVOICING PROCEDURES

- 1. Collection Fee: 30%. This amount is taken from the total balance paid.
- 2. <u>Invoicing type</u>: <u>Gross</u>- MVBA LLC will send 100% of the payment to the client weekly. At the end of the month we will invoice the client for 30% of the money taken.

CONTRACT FOR THE COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTY OF CHEROKEE

THIS CONTRACT is made and entered into by and between the CITY OF RUSK, TEXAS, acting herein by and through its governing body, hereinafter styled, "City", and MVBA, LLC dba ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE COLLECTIONS GROUP.

T.

The City agrees to retain and does hereby retain MVBA, LLC dba ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE COLLECTIONS GROUP to provide services related to the collection of delinquent accounts receivable, including, but not limited to, delinquent utility bills; emergency medical services; and the cost incurred by the City or authorized by the City Code to be imposed by the City to bring any property into compliance with the City Code including, assessments for the mowing of vacant lots, removal of trash and debris from vacant lots, demolition of substandard structures and abatement of other nuisances by the City ("Delinquent Accounts Receivable") pursuant to the terms and conditions described herein. MVBA, LLC may use its dba, Accounts Receivable Collections Group, on collection notices and telephone commications with debtors. The City authorizes MVBA, LLC to execute all documents that are reasonably necessary to pursue collection of the City's claims in connection with the collection of delinquent accounts receivable that are subject to this contract. This contract supersedes all prior oral and written contracts between the parties regarding delinquent accounts receivable and can only be amended if done so in writing and signed by all parties. Furthermore, this contract cannot be transferred or assigned by either party without the written consent of all parties.

II.

For purposes of this contract Delinquent Accounts Receivable shall be considered delinquent and referred to MVBA, LLC when not timely paid in accordance with any applicable contract, ordinance or statute providing for the payment of the underlying debt.

At least once each month on a date or dates agreed upon by the parties, the City will provide MVBA, LLC with copies of, or access to, the information and documentation necessary to collect the Delinquent Accounts Receivable that are subject to this contract. The City shall furnish the information to MVBA, LLC by electronic transmission, magnetic medium.

MVBA, LLC shall forward to the City copies of any correspondence regarding a disputed debt received from a debtor and the request for verification of the debt. The City will provide to MVBA, LLC within ten (10) days of the receipt for the request for verification of the debt, copies of all records which will verify the debt which in turn will be forwarded to the debtor by MVBA, LLC. All collection activity will be suspended on any disputed debt until the appropriate verification of the debt is delivered to the debtor.

IV.

Upon consultation and agreement by both parties hereto, MVBA, LLC may employ an attorney, at its expense, to make a recommendation to the City to take legal action to collect a Delinquent Accounts Receivable or represent the City in any dispute or challenge of its collection authority. Upon consultation and agreement by both parties hereto, MVBA, LLC may employ an attorney, at its expense, to institute civil legal proceedings on behalf of the City, including seeking writs of execution to collect Delinquent Accounts Receivable. The City shall pay in advance of the initiation of any writ of execution or collection lawsuit any filing fees charged by the Court or Clerk of the Court in which the writ of execution is to be issued or the collection lawsuit is to be filed including the costs for service of citation. MVBA, LLC may also, after consultation and agreement by both parties, employ an attorney, at its expense, file proofs of claims in the United States Bankruptcy Court on behalf of the City for Delinquent Accounts Receivable.

V.

MVBA, LLC shall forward all cashier checks or money order payments made payable to the City and any correspondence from debtor directly to the City. Cashier checks or money order payments made payable to MVBA, LLC will be deposited daily into the MVBA, LLC Trust Account. MVBA, LLC may also collect the amount due from the debtor by credit card or electronic draft which is deposited directly into the MVBA, LLC Trust Account. MVBA, LLC may set up payment arrangements and accept partial payments on any delinquent accounts receivable. MVBA, LLC shall remit to the City all payments received into the MVBA, LLC Trust Account weekly, along with an invoice detailing the account number, name of debtor, amount paid to MVBA, LLC or City, MVBA, LLC fee percentage and fees earned for each account.

VI.

MVBA, LLC shall indemnify and hold the City harmless from and against all liabilities, losses and/or costs arising from claims for damages, or suits for losses or damages, including reasonable costs and attorney's fees, which may arise as a result of MVBA, LLC's performance of the services described in this Contract. The indemnity provision of this Contract shall have no application to any claim or demand which results from the sole negligence or fault of the City, its officers, agents, employees or contractors. And furthermore, in the event of joint and/or shared negligence or fault of the City and MVBA, LLC, responsibility and indemnity, if any, shall be apportioned in accordance with Texas law and without waiving any defenses of either party. The provisions of this paragraph are intended for the sole benefit of the parties hereto and are not intended to create or grant any right, contractual or otherwise, to any other persons or entities.

VII.

For the collection of Delinquent Accounts Receivable in which the data files are transmitted to MVBA, LLC by electronic media, the City agrees to pay to MVBA, LLC as compensation for services provided, pursuant to this contract, a fee of thirty percent (30%) of the amount of the Delinquent Accounts Receivable collected.

All compensation shall become the property of MVBA, LLC at the time of payment. The City shall pay to MVBA, LLC said compensation on a monthly basis by check or ACH.

VIII.

The City recognizes and acknowledges that MVBA, LLC owns all right, title and interest in certain proprietary software that MVBA, LLC may utilize in conjunction with performing the services provided in the contract. The City agrees and hereby grants to MVBA, LLC the right to use and incorporate any information provided by the City ("account or debtor information") to update the databases in this proprietary software, and, notwithstanding that the case or defendant information has been or shall be used to update the databases in this proprietary software, further stipulates and agrees that the City shall have no rights or ownership whatsoever in and to the software or the data contained therein, except that the City shall be entitled to obtain a copy of such data that directly relates to the City's accounts at any time.

MVBA, LLC agrees that it will not share or disclose any specific confidential account or debtor information with any other company, individual, organization or agency, without the prior written consent of the City, except as may be required by law or where such information is otherwise publicly available. It is agreed that MVBA, LLC shall have the right to use account or debtor information for internal analysis, improving the proprietary software and database, and generating aggregate data and statistics that may inherently contain account or debtor information. These aggregate statistics are owned solely by MVBA, LLC and will generally be used internally, but may be shared with MVBA, LLC's affiliates, partners or other third parties for purposes of improving MVBA, LLC's software and services.

MVBA, LLC and the City agrees that collection activity will not continue or commence on any accounts that are time-barred by the four-year statute of limitations in accordance with Section 16.004(a)(3) of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code. MVBA, LLC and the City agree that the time-barred accounts will be returned to the City. Upon return of these accounts, neither party will have any obligation to the other party to this contract.

MVBA, LLC reserves the right to return to the City all accounts not collected within one (1) year of referral by the City or identified as being in bankruptcy. Upon return of these accounts, neither party will have any obligation to the other party to this contract.

The initial term of this contract is **five years, beginning on the first day of the month following the execution of this contract by both parties,** and shall automatically renew on the anniversary date and continue in full force and effect thereafter from year to year for additional twelve month periods on the same terms and conditions unless either party delivers written "Notice of Termination of Contract" to the other party of its intent to terminate this contract at least sixty (60) days prior to each anniversary date of this contract.

In the event that the City terminates this contract, MVBA, LLC shall be entitled to continue its collection activity on all accounts previously referred to MVBA, LLC for six (6) months from the date of receipt of the "Notice of Termination of Contract" and to payment of its fee, pursuant to Paragraph VII of this contract for all amounts collected on accounts referred to MVBA, LLC. The City may, at its discretion, refer additional accounts to MVBA, LLC after notice of termination has been received by MVBA, LLC. At the end of the six (6) month period, all accounts shall be returned to the City by MVBA, LLC.

Interlocal Agreement

MVBA, LLC agrees to extend prices and terms to all entities or other political subdivisions or municipalities who have entered or will enter into joint purchasing interlocal cooperation agreement(s) with the City.

X.

For purposes of sending notice under the term of this contract, all notices from the City shall be sent to MVBA, LLC by certified United States mail to the following address:

City of Rusk, Texas Attention: City Manager 205 S. Main St. Rusk, Texas 75785 This contract is made and is to be interpreted under the laws of the State of Texas. Exclusive venue for any action, lawsuit, claim, dispute or another legal proceeding concerning or arising out of this contract shall be in Cherokee County, Texas.

In the event that any provision(s) of this contract shall for any reason be held invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of that provision(s) shall not affect any other provision(s) of this contract, and it shall further be construed as if the invalid or unenforceable provision(s) had never been a part of this contract.

Every provision of this Contract is intended to be severable. If any term or provision of this Contract is deemed to be invalid, void, or unenforceable for any reason by a District Court, to the extent possible such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Contract, it being intended that such remaining provisions shall be construed in a manner most closely approximating the intention of the Parties with respect to the invalid, void, or unenforceable provision or part thereof.

In accordance with the requirements of Chapter 2271, Texas Government Code, the signatory executing this Contract on behalf of MVBA does hereby verify that MVBA does not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel during the term of this Contract. In accordance with the requirements of Chapter 2274, Texas Government Code, the signatory executing this Contract on behalf of MVBA does hereby verify that MVBA 1) does not and will not boycott energy companies and will not boycott energy companies during the term of this Contract, and 2) does not have a practice, policy, guidance, or directive that discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade association, and will not discriminate during the term of the Contract against a firearm entity or firearm trade association.

XII.

In consideration of the terms and compensation herein stated, MVBA, LLC hereby agrees to undertake performance of said contract as set forth above.

The City has authorized by order heretofore passed and duly recorded in its minutes the chief executive officer to execute this contract.

This contract may be executed in any number of counterparts, and each counterpart shall be deemed an original for all purposes. Signed facsimiles shall be binding and enforceable.

The monthly statistical data for the Police Department's operations for the month of January 2023 is attached to this memorandum.

We are still under staffed and have several vacant positions. We hired on officer during January. Officer David Berryman started on January 2nd and has already made a positive impact in our community. A badge pinning ceremony was held for Officers Smith and Berryman in early January.

We are still short of reaching our authorized budgeted staffing allocation for this fiscal year. We are currently conducting background checks on several potential candidates. It is only a matter of time before we reach our authorized strength. We have made great strides in hiring quality candidates. Our challenge now will be in retaining employees for the long term.

This month we continued to host our Coffee with a Cop program with local businesses.

As part of the community engagement program and to keep our schools safe, officers continue to visit Rusk ISD schools. Officers have also gotten out of their patrol vehicles more in order to build relationships with our community. Some of our community policing engagement can be seen on our Facebook page.

Unfortunately, again this year we were forced to cancel our Citizens Police Academy for lack of community participation.

On January 17th, I submitted to the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement the department's racial profiling report and analysis for 2022. I have attached the report to this memorandum. Of particular note is that out of almost three thousand (3,000) motor vehicle stops initiated by Rusk police officers in 2022, the department did not receive any complaints from the public alleging racial profiling. I am happy to report that an analysis of the raw data shows that Rusk police officers do not engage in racial profiling. Once the report is formally presented to the City Council, I will post the report on our Facebook page so the citizens of Rusk can review the data.
