This is a shorter agenda this year the public hearings, action items and dealing with the budget and tax rate have been moved to September 19, 2024. There is a scheduled Public Hearing on moving elections from May to November and 3 Executive Sessions.

- A. This item is a topic we've briefly discussed during the budget workshop. The 88th Texas Legislature enacted Senate Bill 2258 has allowed cities that are council-manager form of government, less than 9,000 population, and currently holds its general election on the May uniform election date each year to move its elections to November with holding a public hearing and a council vote. This allows us to more easily contract with the County for our elections as well as access a larger voter response to the Federal, State and County elections being held at the same time.
- B. This is the corresponding ordinance to approve the extra .13 (approx.) cents per 100 to property taxes for the street paving project.
- C. This is to cast your vote for the TML Region 15 Director. Each city is entitled to one vote and the choices are Jesse Casey, Mayor of Hallsville (Incumbent) or Chuck Huckaby, Vice Mayor Pro Tem, Nacogdoches. Additional information is in your packet.
- D. We have 1 police officer who is currently an active National Guard member. This updates our personnel policy to reflect accommodation of the time required to continue to serve.

Resolution No 2024-

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RUSK, TEXAS, CHANGING THE GENERAL ELECTION DATE FOR MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL FROM THE MAY UNIFORM ELECTION DATE TO THE NOVEMBER UNIFORM ELECTION DATE AS AUTHORIZED BY TEXAS ELECTION CODE 41.0052(f); PROVIDING FOR TERMS OF OFFICE OF CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS TO BE ADJUSTED; ACCORDINGLY, PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, a political subdivision is only authorized to move its general election date from the May uniform election date to the November uniform election date if specifically authorized by law; and

WHEREAS, the 88th Texas Legislature enacted Senate Bill 2258 amending the Texas Election Code 41.00052 by adding Subsection (f) thereto; and

WHEREAS, 41.0052(f) authorizes the governing body of a city with a population of 9,000 or less, located predominantly in a county that has a total area of less than 4,800 miles, that has adopted a council-manager form of government, and currently holds its general election on the May uniform election date each year; and

WHEREAS, in previously held municipal elections, City staff found it difficult to secure the needed personnel in positions as election judges, alternate judges, and election clerks to volunteer to work the City's designated polling location; and

WHEREAS, a review of the number of voters casting votes in the City's general elections in the last fifty years has been historically low in comparison to the number of registered voters in the City; and

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held on September 12, 2024, to enable any interested person or citizens of the City of Rusk to appear and be heard and offer comment regarding the proposal; to change the City's general election date from the May uniform election date to the November uniform election date; and

WHEREAS, the notice of the Public Hearing was (a) published twice in the City's official newspaper, The Cherokeean on August 28, 2024 and September 4, 2024 and (b) posted on August 28, 2024 the City's public bulletin board, a place open and available to the public twenty-four hours a day, and (c) published on August 28, 2024 on the City's internet website www.rusktx.org

And such notice remained so posted and published continuously through the time and date of the Public Hearing; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes changing the City's general election date from the May uniform election date to the November election date will enhance the pursuit of democracy as a greater number of the voting citizens of the City may turn out to vote on the November uniform election date, and the City staff will be able to more efficiently plan for and assist the election process.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RUSK, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the city council, in accordance with Texas Election Code 41.0052(f), changes the City's general election date from the May uniform election date to the November uniform election date as established by law.

SECTION 2. In accordance with 41.0052(b) of the Texas Election Code, the City Council hereby adjusts the terms of office to conform to the November uniform election date as follows:

- (a) The terms of City Council Members elected to Mayor or City Council which currently expire in May 2025 shall be extended until the November 2025 uniform election date.
- (b) The terms of City Council Members for District 3, District 4, and District 5 terms that expire in May 2026 shall be extended until the November 2026 uniform election date.
- (c) Therefore, each City Council Member and Mayor shall serve for a two-year term following the regular City election held in November.

SECTION 3. It is hereby officially found and determined that this meeting was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given, all as required by the Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code.

SECTION 4. Should any section or part of this Resolution be held unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, or the application to any person or circumstance for any reasons thereof ineffective or inapplicable, such unconstitutionality, illegality, invalidity, or ineffectiveness of such section or part shall in no way affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining portion or portions hereof; but as to such remaining portion or portions, the same shall be and remain in full force and effect and to this end the provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable.

SECTION 5. That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Jesse Casey, Mayor, Hallsville (Incumbent)

Jesse Casey has served as the mayor of the City of Hallsville since 2017. He's also held several positions with TML, including Region 15 president (2021-present), Region 15 director (May 2024-present), and Region 15 vice president (2019-2021). He is a board member of the East Texas Council of Governments, president of the Hallsville Lions Club, and a former member of the Texas City Officials ERCOT Advisory Board. Casey earned his Bachelor of Science in Secondary Education from the University of Texas at Tyler and a Master of Education from Stephen F. Austin University. He served 16 years as a math teacher and coach and 19 years as an administrator at Hallsville Independent School District. Casey attends the First Baptist Church in Hallsville, serving as a deacon and Sunday school teacher. He and his wife of 33 years, Melissa Warren, have three

children and 11 grandchildren.



Chad Huckaby, Vice Mayor Pro Tem, Nacogdoches

Born and raised in Nacogdoches, Chad Huckaby is serving his second term on the Nacogdoches City Council. Dr. Huckaby is a member of the faculty at Angelina College. He is a former Mr. SFA, was formerly appointed by Texas Governor Greg Abbott to serve as student member of the Stephen F. Austin State University Board of Regents, and has served as Minister of Music for the Martinsville Baptist Church for 14 years. He is also a technologies consultant for a rural independent school district. During his time as a member of the city council, Huckaby's leadership has not gone unnoticed by his peers. He has recently been elected by members to serve as vice mayor pro tempore and has been named to the Deep East Texas Council of Governments Board of Directors. During his first term on the council, Huckaby worked with members and residents to help

develop seven bond proposals totaling approximately \$49 million, proposals that were all passed by voters overwhelmingly. For the past several years, he has served as a member of the Nacogdoches Independent School District Citizens Bond Review Committee. In the spring of 2024, Huckaby was selected by the hometown newspaper, the *Nacogdoches Daily Sentinel*, as one of the Shining Stars of Nacogdoches. More recently, Huckaby has received recognition from the National Association of Social Workers. The Deep East Texas Branch of the National Association honored Huckaby as the 2024 Elected Official of the Year. Huckaby earned both a bachelor's degree and master's degree from SFA and his PhD from Texas A&M University. He and his wife, Candra, a public school administrator, have one son.

Section 5-05 Military Leave

It is the position of the City of Rusk to be compliant with all Federal and State laws regarding the use of military leave.

1. Eligibility and Procedures:

All full and part time regular employees who are actively participating in the United States Reserves or National/State Guard are eligible to use military leave in accordance with the following:

A. There is no accrual of military leave. Up to fifteen (15) paid days, per calendar year, of military leave is available for use as required by Law.

B. Unused military leave time will not be paid out at the time of separation.

C. An employee wishing to use military leave will submit a written request for leave and a copy of written orders to their supervisor as soon as possible after notification of or volunteering for duty.

While the City requires written notice of military leave request it does recognize that an occasion may arise where advance notice is not possible. When this occurs, upon return to work, the employee will be required to submit either a copy of official orders or another form of official documentation for the time period away from work.

ii. The supervisor may seek verification of any military leave used.

D. Once a request for leave has been received the supervisor will complete a status change/payroll form indicating the length of the leave. The supervisor will also forward a copy of the request and the military orders to the employee's official file and notify the City Manager of the leave.

E. The City has no obligation to pay an employee on military leave for training days that occur on a regular day off or outside of work time.

1. Military Leave – 15 Days or Less

Employees will receive pay at their normal base rate for up to fifteen (15) workdays in a calendar year.

2. Extended Military Leave – 16 Days or More

A. All leave days beyond the fifteen (15) may be paid, at the employee's discretion, using accrued PTO.

B. The employee may also choose to take the remaining duty days as unpaid.

C. All leave accruals based on job performance cease.

3. Misuse/Misrepresentation

Misuse or misrepresentation of the use of military leave is a serious offense and will be handled through the disciplinary process. This includes not returning to work on the next regularly scheduled workday/shift after completion of any military leave.

Filing of false military documents or orders for the purpose of receiving military leave is also a serious military offense and is covered under the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ). The City takes the position that if any such documents are discovered the offense will be reported to the appropriate unit or command authority.

4. Uniformed Service Employment and Reemployment Rights Act

The Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA) protects the job rights of individuals who perform duty, voluntarily or involuntarily, in the "uniformed services." USERRA also prohibits employers from discriminating against past and present members of the uniformed services and applicants to the uniformed services. Those that served have the right to be reemployed if they left to perform service in the uniformed service and meet these requirements:

- A. The employee must have been absent from a civilian job on account of service in the uniformed services;
- B. The employee must have given advance notice to the employer that he or she was leaving the job for service in the uniformed services, unless such notice was prevented by military necessity or otherwise impossible or unreasonable;
- C. The cumulative period of military service with the City of Rusk must not have exceeded five years;
- D. The employee must not have been released from service under dishonorable or other punitive conditions; and
- E. The person must have reported back to the civilian job in a timely manner or have submitted a timely application for reemployment, unless timely reporting back or application was impossible or unreasonable.

If eligible to be reemployed, the employee must be restored to the job and benefits they would have attained if they had not been absent due to military service or, in some cases, a comparable job.
