**Candidate Application Packet**

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**Purpose of This Packet**

This packet is provided by the City of Rusk to individuals interested in running for **City Council** in the **May 2, 2026 General Election**. It contains required forms, filing instructions, and key legal information in accordance with the Texas Election Code and guidance from the Texas Secretary of State (SOS).

The City of Rusk remains **neutral** in all election matters. City staff may provide general information but **may not assist candidates in completing filing documents**.

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**Offices on the Ballot**

The following **City Council Districts** are on the ballot for the May 2, 2026 election:

- **City Council – District 3**
- **City Council – District 4**
- **City Council – District 5**

Each candidate must file **for one specific district**. A candidate may not file for more than one district.

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**Filing Authority**

All candidate applications must be filed with:

Applications are accepted **only during the official filing period** and must be received by the City Secretary by the filing deadline.

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## **Candidate Filing Period**

For the May 2, 2026 uniform election date:

- **First Day to File:** Wednesday, **January 14, 2026**
- **Last Day to File:** Friday, **February 13, 2026**, by 5:00 p.m.

Applications received before or after this period **cannot be accepted**.

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## **Required Filing Form**

### **Application for a Place on the Ballot**

Candidates must complete the official Texas Secretary of State form:

**“Application for a Place on the Ballot – General Election (Local Political Subdivision)”**

On the application, the candidate must clearly indicate the office sought as one of the following:

- City Council, **District 3**
- City Council, **District 4**
- City Council, **District 5**

This is the only application that will be accepted.

### **Important Notes:**

- The application must be **completed and signed by the candidate**.
- Certain portions of the application **must be notarized**.
- The application must be **complete at the time of filing**.
- Applications that do not clearly specify the district sought **cannot be accepted**.

The form is available:

- In paper form at City Hall
- On the Texas Secretary of State website (Elections Forms – Political Subdivisions)

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## **Candidate Eligibility Requirements (Summary)**

To be eligible for City Council for a specific district, a candidate must:

- Be a **United States citizen**;
- Be a **registered voter** in the **district** the candidate seeks to represent;
- Have resided in the **district** for the period required by law;
- Be at least **18 years of age** by Election Day;
- Not have been finally convicted of certain offenses relating to public office.

Candidates are responsible for ensuring they meet all eligibility requirements for the district they seek.

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## **Method of Filing**

Applications may be filed:

- **In person** at City Hall during normal business hours; or
- **By mail** (must be received by the filing deadline);
- **By fax or email**, if permitted and if the application is properly notarized.

The filing is not complete unless **all required components** (application and filing fee or petition) are received together.

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## **Filing Fee or Petition in Lieu of Filing Fee**

The City of Rusk **does not charge a filing fee** for candidates seeking election to City Council.

Accordingly, candidates **are not required to pay a filing fee** and **are not required to submit a petition in lieu of a filing fee** in order to qualify for placement on the ballot.

To be eligible for placement on the ballot, a candidate must timely file a **completed Application for a Place on the Ballot** with the City Secretary during the official filing period and meet all eligibility requirements prescribed by law.

No filing fee, payment, or petition is required.

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## **Campaign Finance & Ethics Requirements**

Candidates are responsible for complying with all Texas Ethics Commission (TEC) requirements, including:

- Filing a **Campaign Treasurer Appointment (Form CTA)**, if required;
- Filing required campaign finance reports;
- Complying with political advertising disclosure laws.

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## **Notice of Deadline to File**

The City of Rusk has posted a **Notice of Deadline to File an Application for Place on the Ballot** in accordance with the Texas Election Code.

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## **Important Reminders**

- City staff cannot assist in completing candidate applications.
- Incomplete or late filings **cannot be accepted**.
- Candidates are encouraged to file early to allow time to correct any deficiencies.

## INSTRUCTIONS

An application for a place on the general election for a city, school district or other political subdivision, may not be filed earlier than 30 days before the deadline prescribed by this code for filing the application. An application filed before that day is void. All fields of the application **must** be completed unless specifically marked optional.

For an election to be held on a uniform election date, the day of the filing deadline is the 78th day before Election Day.

## NEPOTISM LAW

The candidate must sign this statement indicating his awareness of the nepotism law. When a candidate signs the application, it is an acknowledgment that the candidate is aware of the nepotism law. The nepotism prohibitions of chapter 573, Government Code, are summarized below:

No officer may appoint, or vote for or confirm the appointment or employment of any person related within the second degree by affinity (marriage) or the third degree by consanguinity (blood) to the officer, or to any other member of the governing body or court on which the officer serves when the compensation of that person is to be paid out of public funds or fees of office. However, nothing in the law prevents the appointment, voting for, or confirmation of anyone who has been continuously employed in the office or employment for the following period prior to the election or appointment of the officer or member related to the employee in the prohibited degree: six months, if the officer or member is elected at an election other than the general election for state and county officers.

No candidate may take action to influence an employee of the office to which the candidate is seeking election or an employee or officer of the governmental body to which the candidate is seeking election regarding the appointment or employment of a person related to the candidate in a prohibited degree as noted above. This prohibition does not apply to a candidate's actions with respect to a bona fide class or category of employees or prospective employees.

Una solicitud presentada antes de ese día es nula. Todos los **campos** de la solicitud **deben** completarse a menos que estén específicamente marcados como opcional.

Para una elección que se lleve a cabo en una fecha de elección uniforme, el día de la fecha límite de presentación es el 78º día antes del día de la elección.

## LEY DE NEPOTISMO

El candidato debe firmar esta declaración indicando su conocimiento de la ley del nepotismo. Cuando un candidato firma la solicitud, es un reconocimiento de que el candidato conoce la ley del nepotismo. Las prohibiciones de nepotismo del capítulo 573, Código de Gobierno, se resumen a continuación:

Ningún funcionario puede nombrar, votar o confirmar el nombramiento o empleo de cualquier persona emparentada dentro del segundo grado por afinidad (matrimonio) o del tercer grado por consanguinidad (sangre) con sí mismo, o con cualquier otro miembro del órgano de gobierno o corte en el que se desempeña cuando la compensación de esa persona debe pagarse con fondos públicos o honorarios del cargo. Sin embargo, nada en la ley impide el nombramiento, la votación o la confirmación de cualquier persona que haya estado empleada continuamente en la oficina o el empleo durante el período siguiente antes de la elección o el nombramiento del funcionario o miembro emparentado con el empleado en el grado prohibido: seis meses, si el funcionario o miembro es elegido en una elección que no sea la elección general para funcionarios estatales y del condado.

Ningún candidato puede tomar medidas para influir en un empleado del cargo al que aspira a ser elegido o en un empleado o funcionario del organismo gubernamental al que aspira a ser elegido en relación con el nombramiento o el empleo de una persona emparentada con el candidato en un grado prohibido, tal como se ha indicado anteriormente. Esta prohibición no se aplica a las acciones de un candidato con respecto a una clase o categoría de buena fe de empleados o empleados prospectos.

# CODE OF FAIR CAMPAIGN PRACTICES

There are basic principles of decency, honesty, and fair play that every candidate and political committee in this state has a moral obligation to observe and uphold, in order that, after vigorously contested but fairly conducted campaigns, our citizens may exercise their constitutional rights to a free and untrammeled choice and the will of the people may be fully and clearly expressed on the issues.

## THEREFORE:

- (1) I will conduct the campaign openly and publicly and limit attacks on my opponent to legitimate challenges to my opponent's record and stated positions on issues.
- (2) I will not use or permit the use of character defamation, whispering campaigns, libel, slander, or scurrilous attacks on any candidate or the candidate's personal or family life.
- (3) I will not use or permit any appeal to negative prejudice based on race, sex, religion, or national origin.
- (4) I will not use campaign material of any sort that misrepresents, distorts, or otherwise falsifies the facts, nor will I use malicious or unfounded accusations that aim at creating or exploiting doubts, without justification, as to the personal integrity or patriotism of my opponent.
- (5) I will not undertake or condone any dishonest or unethical practice that tends to corrupt or undermine our system of free elections or that hampers or prevents the full and free expression of the will of the voters, including any activity aimed at intimidating voters or discouraging them from voting.
- (6) I will defend and uphold the right of every qualified voter to full and equal participation in the electoral process, and will not engage in any activity aimed at intimidating voters or discouraging them from voting.
- (7) I will immediately and publicly repudiate methods and tactics that may come from others that I have pledged not to use or condone. I shall take firm action against any subordinate who violates any provision of this code or the laws governing elections.

I, the undersigned, candidate for election to public office in the State of Texas or campaign treasurer of a political committee, hereby voluntarily endorse, subscribe to, and solemnly pledge myself to conduct the campaign in accordance with the above principles and practices.

# Filing Deadlines



## Filing Deadlines – Local General Election

- Candidates seeking to have their name placed on the ballot in a local election must file a candidate application with the appropriate filing authority.
  - Some political subdivisions may also require a filing fee and/or a petition in lieu of a filing fee to be filed along with the candidate application
    - If so, those must be filed at the same time with the proper filing authority
- **Filing Deadline**
  - Typically the filing deadline is **5 p.m. of the 78<sup>th</sup> day before election day**, and the filing period begins 30 days before the filing deadline.



## Filing Deadlines – Write-in Candidates

- In most political subdivisions, a candidate may run for office as a declared write-in candidate.
  - A declared Write-in Candidate must submit a Declaration of Write-in Candidacy and submit a filing fee or petition in lieu of a filing fee, if required by the political subdivision.
- **Filing Deadline**
  - For an election held on a uniform election date (May or November) the deadline to file a declaration of write-in candidacy is **5 p.m. of the 74<sup>th</sup> day before election day**



## Filing Deadlines to Fill a Vacancy – Running for an Unexpired Term

- Candidates seeking to have their name placed on the ballot in a local election for an *unexpired term* must file a candidate application.
- **Filing Deadline**
  - Ordered as part of the general election:
    - The filing deadline will be the same as the filing deadline for the general election



## Filing Deadlines to Fill a Vacancy – Running for an Unexpired Term

- **Filing Deadline**
  - Special Election is on or after the 70<sup>th</sup> day after the date the election is ordered
    - Filing deadline is **5 p.m. of the 62<sup>nd</sup> day before election day**
  - Special Election is on or after the 46<sup>th</sup> day and before the 70<sup>th</sup> day after the date the election is ordered.
    - Filing deadline is **5 p.m. of the 40<sup>th</sup> day before election day**



## Method of Filing

- Applications can be delivered in person or by mail.
  - If by mail: Must look at time of receipt, **NOT** postmark.
    - Receipt = actual possession of filing authority or agent, or time deposited in the authority's mail box.
  - Application cannot be submitted in parts. All parts must be submitted at the same time.
    - If a candidate submits a filing fee along with an application, it **MAY NOT** be submitted via email or fax.
    - If a candidate submits a petition in lieu of a filing fee along with an application, those may be submitted together via email or fax.

- **Form, Content and Procedure**
  - Was the candidate application submitted timely?
  - Was it filled out properly?
- **Eligibility**
  - On the face of the application, does the candidate meet the eligibility requirements associated with that office?



## Review of Candidate Application

- **Form, Content, and Procedure**

- Review must be completed no later than 5th day after application is received (unless there is a petition).
- Accepting application does not preclude a later determination that there is a deficiency in the application.
- If rejecting, must do so **immediately** and deliver to candidate a **written notice of rejection**.
- Cannot challenge after the 50th day before election day



## Review of Candidate Petition (if Applicable)

- **Review of Petition (141.032, TEC)**
  - Petition is part of application and review should be completed as soon as practicable.
  - Deficiency in petition cannot be cured with information provided in application.
  - **Unless the petition is challenged, the authority is only required to review the petition for facial compliance with the applicable requirements as to form, content, and procedure.**



# Administrative Declaration of Ineligibility

- **Eligibility**
  - Filing authority MAY administratively declare candidate ineligible if:
    - Information on candidate application indicates ineligible for office, OR
    - Conclusive public record shows ineligible.

**NOTE:** There is NO public record that conclusively establishes residency.

- **Box 8: Public Email Address, if available**

- This should be the email address used to receive campaign email. Public address does NOT mean the candidate's county or government email address as a public official.

- **Box 9: Occupation**

- Required per Section 141.031, Texas Election Code. However, please review In re Anthony, 642 S.W.3d 588 (Tex. 2022).

- **Box 10: Date of Birth**

- Used to validate that the candidate meets minimum age requirements.

- **Box 11: VR Number (VUID)**

- Not required, but very helpful as it can help the filing authority to validate a candidate's VR status, if applicable.

- **Box 12: Contact information**

- Optional, but helpful if the filing authority needs to contact a candidate.



## Eligibility

- **Voter Registration**

- Is the candidate a registered voter of the territory from which they are seeking office? Is the candidate's registration effective?
  - by the date of the filing deadline (for place on the ballot) OR
  - election day (for write-in)
- A candidate's registration must be **EFFECTIVE**. It is not enough to have submitted a registration application.

- Must be completed.
- Must indicate how long the candidate has lived in the state **AND** territory for which they are seeking office.
- Check Qualifications for Public Office chart if you have questions on requirements.



## Eligibility

- **Length of Continuous Residence**

- Has the candidate been a resident of the territory elected from for the required period of time?
  - **Regular Candidate:** the date of the regular filing deadline for a candidate's application for a place on the ballot
  - **Write-in:** the date of the election at which the candidate's name is written in

\*If using a nickname as part of your name to appear on the ballot, you are also signing and swearing to the following statements: I further swear that my nickname does not constitute a slogan or contain a title, nor does it indicate a political, economic, social, or religious view or affiliation. I have been commonly known by this nickname for at least three years prior to this election. Please review sections 52.031, 52.032 and 52.033 of the Texas Election Code regarding the rules for how names may be listed on the official ballot.

I further swear that the foregoing statements included in my application are in all things true and correct."

- **Box 15: Oath and Notary**

- Must be completed and signed and sworn to by candidate.
- If the candidate leaves blanks in statement of oath, it is not fatal if the application (Not Petition) contains the applicable information.
- Mistakes by the notary are not always fatal. Please call SOS for additional guidance if that happens.

## Which Candidates are Required to Submit a Petition?

- Typically, candidates for local political subdivisions are not required to submit a nominating petition along with their application.
  - Candidates in a home rule city should check the city charter as a city charter may prescribe additional requirements in connection with a candidate's application.



## Important Things to Remember Regarding Petitions

- Unless prescribed by a city charter or outside statute, there is no statutory “first day” that a candidate may begin collecting signatures for a nominating petition or petition in lieu of a filing fee under the Election Code.
- If a candidate circulates a petition, the voters who sign the petition must be registered voters of the territory.
- **Candidate may have multiple people circulate petition on their behalf**
  - **Affidavit of Circulator** must be completed for each group of petitions circulated. The affidavit at the bottom of the page must accompany each part but is not required for each page of signatures.
    - Affidavit of circulator need only be sworn on one page to serve for multiple pages from **the same circulator**.
    - A single notarized affidavit by any person who obtained signatures is valid for all signatures gathered by the person **if the date of notarization is on or after the date of the last signature obtained by the person**.
- A deficiency on the petition CANNOT be cured with information provided on the application.



## Petition in Lieu of Filing Fee

- Must be submitted **in person, by mail, by email or by fax**.
- Petitions must be submitted along with the candidate's application.
  - A candidate cannot supplement or amend a petition once it has been filed.



## Public Information

- An application for a place on the ballot, including an accompanying petition, is public information immediately on its filing.
  - Any written documentation attached to a candidate's application would also be public information upon filing as it is considered part of the application.

## Withdrawal

- A candidate may withdraw their application and have their name omitted from the ballot by submitting a notarized [Certificate of Withdrawal \(PDF\)](#) or a notarized letter to the same filing authority.
- To be effective, a withdrawal must be:
  - In writing, signed, and sworn to by the candidate; and
  - Be timely filed with the filing authority
- The deadline for a candidate to file their withdrawal is **5 p.m. of the 71<sup>st</sup> day before election day**.
